The charity is supported by volunteers in Australia, serving as Board members, handling fundraising and organising the choir tours. This allows all of the funds raised by 100% hOPE to go directly to the work in Uganda. The staff at hOPE Village is locally employed, providing employment for the local community.



Family-Style Group Homes

Creating a safe and loving environment is at the heart of the design of the 100% hOPE homes. The accommodation is based on typical local homes with an emphasis on family-style living with bedrooms, kitchen, lounge and dining room. The typical local family size is matched with eight children and one house parent in each home.



100% hOPE

With a heart full of love for orphaned, abandoned and underprivileged children, Gold Coast school teacher Trishelle Sayuuni (nee Grady) founded 100% hOPE in 2011, on a mission to create long-term change. Partnering with local, poverty-stricken communities in Uganda, 100% hOPE promotes the spiritual, economic, physical and emotional development of orphaned and underprivileged children. Trishelle heads the organisation in Uganda, where she has made her home with African husband Fred and their four children.


This approach will enable generations of African children to have a future and a hope through education and ongoing developmental support in family-style group homes. hOPE Village, built on 14 acres of land in Mityana, includes children's homes, a primary school, vocational training, as well as self-sustainable projects including a piggery sponsored by the Australian Government. Future projects include a medical centre and a secondary school. In 2018, 133 children were supported through the Future hOPE program, including 74 living in homes in the hOPE village.

100% hOPE has an Australian Board and is registered with the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission (ACNC), therefore has tax-deductable gift recipient (DGR) status.

Age Distribution of Ugandan Population

- 50% of population under age 14
- Over 2.5m children orphaned
- 1.2m children lost both parents to AIDS
- 1.4 million people live with HIV
- 28,000 AIDS related deaths in 2016

Over the last 35 years, HIV and AIDS, war and civil unrest have significantly impacted the adult portion of Uganda's population, leaving far too few parents looking after Uganda's children under 14 who now make up half the population. UNICEF estimates that Uganda has more than 2.5 million orphaned children, with 48% of them having lost both parents to AIDS. The number of people in Uganda living with HIV is estimated at 1.4 million (UNAIDS estimate). This has taken an enormous toll on Ugandan society.

Self-Sustainability

At 100% hOPE, we strongly believe in the importance of self-sustainability. In addition to hOPE Village growing some of its own food, the grounds host a forestry project, a mango orchard, cows and a piggery. This provides the children with important life skills in resources management and conservation, as well as developing additional revenue streams.

The 100% hOPE School

The purpose-built primary school in hOPE Village, which opened in 2015, is not only open to children from 100% hOPE, but to other local students as well. It has the highest quality teaching, facilities and resources in Mityana, with a vision to raise the future leaders of Uqanda.

100% hOPE Choir Australian tours

In 2016, on their first ever trip outside Uganda, the choir raised \$150,000 travelling for three months between the Gold Coast and Sydney, to fund five classrooms at their new school and expand their supporter base. They raised enough funds for boys' homes via a Facebook appeal, but the choir returned in 2017 to raise funds for homes for the girls who were still sleeping in the classrooms.

During the Choir's three-month 2017 tour, more than \$270,000 was raised. Sydney, the most successful city visited raised \$71,000 in just two weeks. Funds raised on these tours supplement more regular giving opportunities such as appeals, events and child sponsorship. For the previous two tours, the choir's airfares were paid for by the sponsors of the children and most of the needs and expenses including the bus hire for the tour were provided by existing donors. The Choir is currently seeking new donors to cover these expenses for their 2019 visit.

The tours also provide a training and cross-cultural experience for the choir members. Positions in this troupe are naturally highly contested and they train hard for the opportunity. As a consequence the standard is very high.

An authentic African performance

The Choir perform a mix of African traditional and contemporary song and dance items with authentic live rhythmic drumming. Their high energy dance routines are accompanied by singing in a number of tribal languages as well as English. Contemporary dance numbers are also in their repertoire, culminating in headspinning breakdancing, if room allows.

The group performs at schools and other concerts with an emphasis on cross cultural education and the programmes are tailored to the venue and audience. A Q&A with the group provides memorable peer-to-peer education about another culture and life circumstances.
